Landscaping News

- Landscape Committee: Donna English, Amanda Sheets, Jason Sheets, Michelle Durheim Please call Jason Sheets at (208) 602 6835 with concerns.
- The arborist has marked 25 trees (red tape) in the 1st phase to possibly be replaced in Spring 2020 (Merino, Raison, S Palena). Please do not remove the tape! We will evaluate the trees in the remainder of the subdivision in Fall 2019.
- Starting next week (July 9), the Developer will provide pruning, staking, and fertilizing of the common area and "mow strip" trees. Most of these trees are marked with yellow tape.
- After this first fertilizing, pruning, staking of the Phase 1 mow strip trees, the trees will become the responsibility of each homeowner. Common area trees will be the responsibility of the HOA.
- Phase 2 common area and mow strip trees will follow the same schedule next year (replacement when necessary at the discretion of the developer/arborist, fertilizing, pruning, staking) with the homeowners eventually taking over on the maintenance of the trees in front of their homes in 2020.
- Lawn Co has offered a package for maintenance to the homeowners of Patagonia: \$19 per tree per application - 4 applications per year OR \$75 per application for entire residence (all trees and shrubs). Please call Lawn Co for details: (208) 323-0234.
